### Rector's Journal

Well, the moving van finally came late Sunday afternoon – Yea! And Jane and I are in the process of de-boxing our worldly possessions and fitting them into our wonderful new rectory. This may take a while, and it is a lot of schlepping things about - but it is also kind of fun. I get to visit with “old friends” again: that teapot that helped warm me on chilly days, that inspirational book that I totally forgot about, etc. I see these old friends also with a new eye: how will they fit into these new surroundings? As we move in there really is a wonderful mixture of old and new.

All this reminds me of that passage from Matthew 13 that describes a scribe (can one de-scribe a scribe?) who is fit for the kingdom. Such a scribe is like a household who brings out of his stores something old and something new. A scribe brings out the old and familiar but is also able to bring a new twist to things.

So that is an appropriate way of describing St. Paul's, Marinette, at the moment: same wonderful liturgy, and yet with the “new kid on the block” things might be a little new and different. I think that this old and new place is a great place to inhabit in that we can be comfortable – but not too.

Maybe there is that spiritual book you could start reading; perhaps some daily Bible meditation, and what about expanding your prayer life? If you need some suggestions, just ask me.

Look, I am here to help you grow spiritually. And with God's help we can do this together. But you may need try something else – go deeper, go broader, go bigger. Let's do this together.
